Certification Committee Report December 4, 2018 From: Molly Webb for Emi Aubertine

- SHRM's 2019 Learning System is getting a revamp, so please be sure to have your chapters order the new Learning System for 2019. A reminder that there is a scholarship through SHRM for chapters to cover the costs of the Learning System- be sure to check out the VLRC!
- SHRM has created a study group tool kit which is located on the
 VLRC. https://communityKey=3fce3c52-fe59-4917-8289-af7d8b4190a9 This tool kit is designed to help facilitate/start study groups and has really great information.
- Each chapter can request a membership list from SHRM that will provide you with the name, dates certification expirations, emails, addresses, etc. This is a great way that your chapter can contact members in advance of their SHRM certification expiring and remind them to recertify. For each member that recertifies in 2018- chapters receive \$10 and state councils \$20. SHRM has also decided to extend this into 2019- so it is a win-win for our members and chapters/state councils. The state council can't request this information, but each chapter can and the state council can help you with contacting if you would like. There is also email templates located on the VLRC.
- New on SHRM's site is the Competency Self- Assessment and if you complete the self-assessment- you can receive one SHRM credit for completing it and you can do this every year. https://www.shrm.org/learningandcareer/career/pages/your-professional-development.aspx It is a great tool for you personally to see where you are in your career and where you can grow, plus receive credits at the same time! Please share with your members.
- Also- If you have members who need to recertify- they can use the code 15OFFCSC to receive \$15 off when they recertify this year. This code will end December 31, 2018.
